




OUR HISTORY

- Founded in 2005 in NYC
- FPCD was created to support the UN Charter and Millennium
 Development Goals by bridging post conflict communities to partners with capacity to assist with their development.
- In 2015 the FPCD expanded with a branch in Monaco under the patronage of HSH Prince Albert II.
- A branch in Asia-Pacific is envisioned in 2025.















FPCD's work impacts communities with health, youth or education projects, with the hope that when communities focus on these projects, there would be less of a reason to reengage in conflict again.




TIMOR-LESTE

Prince Rainier III Maternity Clinic

- The Prince Rainier III Maternity Clinic in Same, Timor-Leste, stands as a beacon of success.
- Opened in 2008, this clinic, built through a partnership between the FPCD and the Monaco Red Cross, has become a model for the country's healthcare system.
- It has demonstrably improved access to maternal care and reduced mortality rates for both mothers and newborns.
- This achievement, reaching 1,000 healthy births within its first year, highlights the importance of collaboration and best practices in maternity care.

Princess Grace Maternity Clinic

- In 2012, the Princess Grace Maternity Clinic opened in Oecusse, Timor-Leste
- The project was launched **30 years** after Princess Grace's visit to the Val de Jamor Timorese refugee camp.
- This collaborative effort, was championed by the FPCD and Timor-Leste's Ministry of Health.
- Offered vital healthcare access to an impoverished and under developed region.



Reforestation and Family Income Project

- In 2008, the FPCD's **Reforestation** and Family Income Project launched in Ermera, Timor-Leste.
- This was a 7 year investment from the Government of Monaco in environmental and community development in partnership with The office of President Ramos— Horta and the Bakhita Center.
- It empowers families with food security and income through kitchen gardens, diversified crops, and animal husbandry, all while promoting reforestation and improved sanitation.
- The project's impact is evident in over 66 hectares of restored land and access to clean water.

HAITI

The Women's Health and Training Center

- The Center opened in 2017 in Saint-Louis-du-Sud, a community 5 hours drive from Port au Prince, Haiti.
- The locally- adapted Center was made possible by a generous donation from the Princely Couple on the occasion of the birth of Their Children.
- The Center is a collaborative effort between the FPCD, The Monaco Red Cross, and implemented by Haiti's Fondation St.Luc.
- It has served over 1,000 patients in its first year and embodies FPCD's commitment to achieving the UN's health goals for sustainable development.



COTE D'IVOIRE

Midwife capacity building project

Midwife Capacity Building Project

- Since 2002, the world has celebrated International Day of the Midwife on May 5th.
- This day recognizes the vital role midwives play, particularly in areas recovering from conflict.
- To strengthen their skills, FPCD designed a special Midwife Capacity Building Project that was launched in Monaco.
- This program provided advanced training for 1 month in Monaco for 2 midwives from Cote d'Ivoire contributing to safer births for mothers and babies.
- Partners include: AMREF, Fondation Sancta Devota and Fight Aids Monaco. HSH Princess Stephanie awarded certificates at the conclusion of the program.



SOUTH AFRICA

The Green Hub Project

Since its launch, HOW Global, FPCD's implementing partner, has been transforming communities in Kwa Zulu Natal, South Africa with their innovative GREEN HUB project.

This initiative establishes special schools that serve as models of sustainability, teaching entire villages about water conservation, agriculture, and sanitation.

Thanks to FPCD's funding, over 20,000 people now have access to clean water and essential needs.

Its impact is expanding to include handwashing stations, sanitation education, and a focus on vulnerable groups like orphans, handicapped children, and elders.





THE PRINCE ALBERT LEADERSHIP IN POST' CONFLICT DEVELOPMENT AWARD

2019

Launched in 2019, brought 2 youth leaders from Timor-Leste and 2 from Monaco together. Represented FPCD at the UN Civil Society Conference.

Learned about the UN and Diplomacy. Certificates signed by HSH Prince Albert II awarded at the Liechtenstein Mission.


2022
